

MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING FAQS

1. WHAT DO THE MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING (RADT) COURSES INVOLVE?

The MRI courses include classroom and clinical experiences. These are rigorous courses which require a substantial commitment from the student in order to be successful.

2. WHERE DO STUDENTS COMPLETE CLINICAL EDUCATION?

Affiliated clinical sites include several hospitals and outpatient centers across the Baltimore metropolitan area.

3. WHAT TIMES ARE CLINICAL HOURS COMPLETED?

The majority of clinical duty is scheduled during daytime hours from Monday through Friday. There are very limited evening and weekend clinical hours available for students who are unable to attend clinical during normal business hours. Students enrolled in clinical are required to complete 16 hours a week of clinical time.

4. WHY ARE A LIMITED NUMBER OF STUDENTS ACCEPTED EACH YEAR?

Due to the limitation in clinical facilities to place the students, the Magnetic Resonance Imaging program can accept only enough students to fill the availability.

5. HOW ARE STUDENTS SELECTED FOR THE MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING PROGRAM?

The MRI program will only accept applicants who are licensed, registered radiographers by the ARRT and the State of Maryland. For the selection process, a scoring rubric will be used based on required and requested documentation.

6. CAN AN APPLICANT BE PLACED ON THE WAITING LIST FOR NEXT YEAR?

Applicants are not carried over from year to year. They would need to re-apply each year and be considered with the pool of applicants for that year.



7. ARE STUDENTS GUARANTEED TO COMPLETE ALL REQUIRED EXAM REPETITIONS FOR THE REGISTRY EXAM IN MRI?

No, we cannot guarantee every student will complete the required exam repetitions in the 9 month program timeframe.

8. CAN STUDENTS REGISTER FOR ONLY THE CLINICAL COMPONENT AND NOT THE DIDACTIC?

No, Students must be enrolled in the didactic component in order to be eligible to take clinical courses.
